

Thomas Handforth Digitization Project CREATOR: SPENCER BOWMAN

- My project goal was to both digitize over
 250 pieces and improve access to this collection.






OUTCOMES

- Inventoried and compiled metadata for each item in the collection.
- Conformed every scanned file to FADGI 4 star quality level for highest image capture quality and long term digital storage.
- Digitally preserved and provided access to a rare and previously unseen art collection.

PROCESS

- Followed Federal Agencies Digital Guidelines
 Initiative (FADGI) guidelines for digitizing cultural
 heritage materials and Library of Congress
 digitization procedures.
- Assembled and utilized touchless overhead photography rig for digitization of friable and fragile media.
- Created finding aids and cataloged digitized art on Tacoma Public Library's catalog by using ContentDM and Dublin Core metadata.
