- Founded in 1872.
- 90% of residential area located in floodplain.
- Significant flooding every 3.5 years.
- Town has been contemplating a move since 1975.

### **Information Challenge**

Understanding the unique community of Hamilton WA, in order to:

- Adequately and respectfully assist the residents who wish to move out of the floodplain to the new town site.
- Create a place that still reflects the personality and qualities that town residents love about Hamilton.

Storytelling Project: A collection of personal narratives and town history, which will be used to inform Forterra's work with Hamilton residents, as well as to inform the building of a community center at the new town site.

#### **Information & Statistics**

- Located in Skagit County, in north-western Washington State.
- > 300 residents, according to the 2010 census.
- > Town of Hamilton has the lowest income of any incorporated community in Skagit County, with 59% of households qualifying with HUD as low-to-moderate income
- > 21.2% of Hamilton families live below the poverty level.
- > FEMA estimates it has spent at least \$10 million helping Hamilton residents recover over the years.
