Washington state's longest serving U.S. Congressman

From 1937 to 1981 Warren G. Magnuson filled various roles in Congress and was a long-time champion of consumer and health legislation, environmental protection, and free trade with the People's Republic of China. He helped establish the National Institute of Health (NIH). And today, the UW Health Sciences Center boasts Warren G. Magnuson's name in honor of his devoted efforts to making UW a leading medical research institution.
