

**1902 - 1946** — Seattle's first high school

- **1974** Original building demolished; Alumni rescue five bags of artifacts and launch the archives
- **2014** Aging Alumni Association disbands; materials languish, mice and dust invade

**2019** — Emerging archivists assess and reinvigorate 250 linear feet of ephemera, textiles, awards, and documents, creating a contemporary archive for use by the community

## The Process: Mold, Mice, and Tigers (Oh My!)

- Comprehensive internal and external assessment and inventory report
- Significant preservation activities: deaccessioning and rehousing while maintaining original order
- Creation of multiple entry points: Archivists' Blog, Finding Aid & Wikipedia article.
