About Mt. Angel

- Mt. Angel is a small community of about 3,600 people approximately eighteen miles northeast of Oregon's capitol.
- The considerable German influence in Mt. Angel is evident in its Bavarian-style storefronts and Glockenspiel- the largest in the United States. The town's four-day Oktoberfest, held every year since 1966, is the largest folk festival in the Northwest.

Mt. Angel Public Library's Director, Jackie Mills, will take the plan to the board for approval. We have provided two budget options that can be adjusted depending on what the board approves. We will remain available for any additional input or legwork for putting the plan into action.

About The Library

- The Library provides tax supported services to all residents living within the Mt. Angel city limits.
- The library holds over 33,000 materials available for check-out with thousands more through inter-library loan with their partner libraries in the Chemeketa Cooperative Regional Library Service.
- People enter the library to utilize print and electronic reference resources, access the Internet through the fiber-optic connection, view an exhibit, or attend one of the library's events.



Our Plan and Its Impact

- Our outreach plan contains a detailed strategy and two different budget proposals for expansion of Mt. Angel's outreach efforts.
- The community will benefit from increased contact with the library's services, and the library will benefit from increased use and impact in the community.
- This plan represents work that the library staff have not previously had the time or resources to complete, filling a gap in their services.
