


The Red Wheelbarrow Digital Literacy Project

The Rub

- Digital illiteracy persists among adults in the coastal Mississippi communities the Jackson-George Regional Library System serves
- JGRLS does not have the human power to meet this need, and JRGLS' current budgetary constraints prevent the hiring of new personnel
- Barriered learners are unlikely to seek help from government agencies due to enrollment criteria
- No state or local public funds or



The Notion

- Develop a model for a digital literacy program that recruits and trains
 volunteers to teach basic computer
 skills to folks using the library
 system's public computers and
 broadband access at its 8 branches
- Host volunteer-led computer learning clinics at Gautier Public Library that are free and open to all comers
- Materialize a mobile computer learning lab to bring the digital

The Work

- Created a recruitment and training model for volunteer computer coaches that can be used by JGRLS staff
- Established a program to connect volunteer coaches with folks who need to learn basic digital literacy skills
- Produced an annotated guide to online portals for local, state, and federal government services and local nonprofits
- Drafted a feasibility study for a mobile computer learning lab to prepare for funding opportunities



The Upshot

- Eight computer clinics held to date with an average of four coaches working with eight participants
- Program can be replicated and used by other JGRLS branches
- Program connects marginalized Mississippians with public and community services
- Coalesces folks from diverse cultures and worldviews around a common goal
- Helps erode the digital divide in Mississippi
