- Green Hill Academic School is a juvenile rehabilitation center in Chehalis, WA that serves over 150 high risk young men aged 17-25, 74% are people of color.
- The library has a very limited budget for books and can't apply for grants that compete with the local school district.







- 1. Develop a new collection for the library with a focus on diverse representation, artistry, and residents' interests.
- 2. Create a month long social media campaign to raise a goal of \$1,500 through our book wishlist and PayPal.
- 3. Present at 3 Minute Thesis.

## \$3,200 Raised

- Our Facebook page reached over 2,500 people.
- \$2,160 was donated to our PayPal account, going directly to Green Hill Library for future collection development.
- 67 new books (87%) were purchased from our wishlist.
