The Problem: Archival Discovery and Access



- European colonial era archives are spread throughout the world in different collections
 - Often uncatalogued and unprocessed
 - Often under poor preservation conditions
 - In a variety of languages
- = Difficult researcher access
- = Lack of interest by those who lack background historical or linguistic knowledge
- = Challenges for encouraging international and area studies and work with non-English language sources

Curated digital humanities exhibits can help introduce library users and researchers to international archival materials, many of which are not in English, providing the context needed to appreciate their intellectual value.

 - Rare French and Vietnamese-language books from 1920s-1960s
 - Classic works by Vietnamese literati in French colonial Indochina

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- TO BRING THIS COLLECTION 'TO LIFE' BY TELLING A STORY ABOUT THE MATERIAL
- TO CREATE A DISPLAY OF A HISTORIC ARCHIVAL COLLECTION THAT WILL INTEREST USERS WHO MIGHT NOT HAVE OTHERWISE KNOWN WHAT IT WAS
- TO INSPIRE ACADEMIC RESEARCHERS TO ENGAGE MORE DEEPLY WITH THIS COLLECTION
- TO SITUATE THE COLLECTION WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF THE LARGER SPECTRUM OF OTHER LIBRARIES' COLLECTIONS AROUND THE WORLD.






The Self-Reliant Literary Movement in Việt Nam (Tự Lực Văn Đoàn):

conservative, French collaborationist, Confucian*




The Nhân Văn-Giai Phẩm Affair (1956-1958)

- VIBRANT POLITICAL AND SOCIAL DEBATES OCCURRING IN VIETNAM IN 1920S-1950S
- LED BY THE LITERATI: NEWSPAPERS, AUTHORS, PUBLISHERS
- BOTH INSTITUTIONAL AND COMMUNITY ARCHIVES DOCUMENT THESE MOVEMENTS AND DIGITIZED WORKS
- CURATED DIGITAL HUMANITIES EXHIBITS CAN BRING THESE COLLECTIONS TOGETHER AND PROVIDE CONTEXT TO IMPROVE ACCESS
