



Project Objectives

Establish a history archive specific to Camano Island and its people in the lower level of a restored 1906 schoolhouse. Organize existing collections, write mission statement, and set up procedures for digitization, metadata creation, and accepting donations.



Unexpected Hurdles

- Collection too large + not enough time to spend on digitizing it all
 - Pivoted to establishing procedures and standards, and training volunteers
- Not as many new volunteers in the last two months as we'd initally hoped for

Insights Gained

- Community volunteers are incredibly useful and should be trained and given projects!
- Archives collections are always going to contain surprises no organization method or metadata standard is going to work for every collection
- An archive focusing on local history should be built with present-day and future users in mind
- Flexibility is key

- Digital catalog available to everyone online
- Collection organization standards in place
- Standard Operating Procedures for:
 - Digitization via scanner and mounted camera
 - Digital file storage/organization
 - Donation acceptance and processing
 - Uploading digital items to CatalogIt
- Volunteers trained in various procedures


