those books as a starting point for


an in-house research library. Our


project was to take those books

Process

- Met with board members to establish scope of the library
- Conducted initial inventory and weeded out of scope books
- Established a Collection
 Development Policy and
 Cataloging SOP
- Cataloged all books from inventory





Outcomes

The Museum has the necessary framework to put in place a fully-functional research library, all that is required is the physical location for patron accessibility.

489 books were cataloged for research and grouped by subject to facilitate browsing. Our team generated Collection Development and Cataloging policies to aid in collection maintenance and support patron needs.
