- Survey: Print & online surveys administerd using Survey Monkey with targeted questions derived from Teen Librarian input, Linville (2004), and Gorman & Suellentrop (2009)
- Personal Conversation: Questions adapted from the Libraries Transoforming Communities Community Conversation Workbook.
- Distribution: Survey shared with the Sylvan Way Library Teen Advisory Board, the Q Center, Coffee Oasis, and school counselors, librarians, and Gay/Straight Alliance advisors throughout Kitsap County.
