Data Within Reach:

Assessments for the Seattle Public Library's Adult

Education Tutoring Program

## Context

Measurable assessment is paramount to a successful outreach program. Recent frameworks for assessment provide guidance for broadly-defined, technology-oriented, or benchmarked assessment-but how do we make sense of existing schemas in light of the complex local community needs? Our project strove to develop a practical assessment tool for tutors and learners participating in Adult Education Drop-in Tutoring at the Seattle Public Library.

# Process

#### Research



 Extensive Literature Review on flexible assessment models and assessment theory.

#### Observation



- Two weeks of intensive site visits.
- 100+ hours of participant-observation of tutoring program.

## Interviews



- Interviewed leading assessment librarian.
- Met with sponsor to accurately align information need with services.
- Opportunistic interviews with participants.

#### Pilot




- Developed prototype of assessment tool.
- Conducted usability testing of prototype over two week period.
- Captured participant feedback regarding assessment process via optional interviews.

### Revision



- Analyzed feedback for emergent themes.
- Revised content and form of piloted assessment tool.



- Creates access to unrestricted, anonymous feedback from learners and tutors.
- Collects data use in the annual SPL Foundation Program Grant.
- Easily integrates into current program format and assists improvements to existing data collection



## Impact on Local Community

- Creates space for learner to self advocate.
- Facilitates self-evaluation for both learners as well as volunteer tutors.
- Acknowledges participant's autonomy and ownership of learning process.
- Cultivates sense of tutoring-learning community.

#### Next Steps

- Develop sustainable survey delivery model to address diverse language and literacy level populations.
- Document process and create recommendations for next team to continue ongoing project.
- Continue to implement assessment tools at regular intervals with comprehensive analysis of gathered data as well as ongoing reflection of assessment process.
