

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Process:

- Chose a topic that highlights DPLA's diverse holdings.
- Wrote an historical analysis of our topic and created cohesive thematic categories.
- · Curated a dynamic collection of images.
- Compiled relevant metadata adhering to Dublin Core Schema standards.
- Designed and built a digital exhibit using the Omeka platform.

Outcomes:

Constructed an innovative online exhibit for the Digital Public Library of America featuring:

- 40 engaging images with descriptive metadata.
- 4 thematic sections focusing on American children's home lives, school, playtime, and work.
- 18 vignettes highlighting the spectrum of experiences that encompass childhoods in America.
